# WHAT IS PARTNERS IN EDUCATION (PIE)?

The overall goal of Columbia's Partners In Education program is to build bridges between the world of business and the world of education. The program serves a five-fold purpose:

- 1. To foster a better understanding of the public school system within the Columbia community;
- 2. To strengthen and enhance the district's programs;
- To create a climate of involvement and interaction between organizations, businesses, and schools;
- To provide students opportunities to develop attitudes and skills that enhance their success in the world of work;
- 5. To support the school district's strategic improvement plan



#### **HOW TO BECOME A PARTNER**

- 1. Contact the Community Relations Department to begin the process.
- 2. Form a PIE Steering Committee and meet with the district's Community Relations Manager to discuss initial activities, define a mission, objectives, and measurable goals.
- 3. Conduct monthly meetings, plan activities, and identify student achievement goals.
- 4. Complete and submit a Business Profile and an annual Partnership Report Form.
- 5. Contact the Community Relations Department for assistance with promoting the partnership within your business and community.
- 6. Coordinate employee volunteer release time to participate in PIE activities.
- 7. Plan a partnership kick-off event with the Community Relations Department to celebrate the partnership.
