## Regular Session, 11th day of February, 2013

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The Board of Education of the School District of Columbia, Boone County, Missouri, met in regular session at the Administration Building, 1818 West Worley Street, at the hour of 6:30 p.m., Central Standard Time, Monday, the 11th day of February, 2013 Those in attendance were as follows:

#### Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by President Rose at 6:30 p.m.

The first matter of business was consideration of the agenda for the February 11, 2013, meeting of the Board of Education. It was moved by Ms. King that the agenda be approved. The second was by Mr. Sessions. The vote was 7 yes—0 no.

## **Consent Agenda**

The Board considered approval of the minutes of the executive session and regular meeting of the Board of Education on January 14, 2013; the minutes of the special session of the Board of Education on January 24, 2013; the minutes of the executive session of the Board of Education on January 29, 2013; acceptance of the treasurer's report; approval of bills; approval of personnel recommendations; and approval of business transactions.

The monthly treasurer's report had been previously provided to the Board of Education by Ms. Quinley. The report showed a beginning balance for the month of January in the amount of \$60.92 million, cash receipts of \$77.99 million, cash disbursements of \$16.98 million, and an ending balance of \$121.93 million. The \$121.93 million was invested in government securities in the amount of \$116.25 million and daily investment accounts in the amount of \$5.68 million. The average interest rate for all investments was 0.18%.

The Board of Education had previously been provided a detailed report of bills and expenditures for the month of January 2013. The report totaled 280 pages. The following is a listing and summary of the bills as provided to the Board of Education:

## **Student Transportation System Discussion**

Dr. Belcher reviewed student transportation options. He recommended a bell schedule that would have middle schools and some elementary schools on the first tier, the remaining elementary schools on the second tier, and high schools on the third tier. The schedule would be as follows:

## Renaming of Junior High Schools for 2013-14 School Year

Dr. Belcher recommended, on behalf of the administration, that the district's three junior high schools be renamed as middle schools effective at the end of the current academic semester. Jefferson Junior High School, Oakland Junior High School, and West Junior High School would be renamed Jefferson Middle School, Oakland Middle School, and West Middle School, respectively. Since district policy FF, "Facility Names," requires Board of Education action to name or rename any school, this item will be presented for consideration of approval at the Board's regular meeting on March 11, 2013.
