

It is the **student's responsibility** to make sure he/she is eligible to participate in athletics or other MSHSAA sponsored activities. If the student has any problems, questions or concerns, they should be remedied BEFORE the beginning of the season and preferably during registration. Parents can assist by understanding a few of the general guidelines and rules for MSHSAA eligibility.

For a student to maintain eligibility:

For academic eligibility, students must be enrolled in and have earned the previous semester 80% of the

maximum allowable credits. For what this means to Hickman students, please see the table below. Dual enrolled students during the regular semester may count college courses up to 1.0 credit per semester toward eligibility as follows:

½ credit for a 3-hour college class or 1 credit for a 5 hour college class

Please see your counselor or the athletic director if this applies to you

Summer school classes may count up to 1 credit towards eligibility for fall participation if:

The class is required for LOCAL graduation
