

We will implement Leadership notebooks schoolwide to promote student goal setting in the areas of ELA, Math, and attendance.

All students who are at risk or not meeting the Missouri Learning Standards will have access to a targeted intervention group K-5 at the Tier 2 level. Those students who are significantly below grade level will also have access to our Tier 3 supports through Title 1 and EL. Leader in Me will also provide students with skills and strategies to become leaders in their learning, as well as leaders in their lives both in and out of school. These strategies allow us to support the whole student.

Instructional mentors and department Coordinators work with teachers on the standards referenced grading with prioritized standards for the students. The District also holds professional development days to target specific instructional needs. District Leader in Me coaches work with teachers to support implementation of the Leader in Me framework.

Describe activities

By becoming a Leader in Me school, we provide teachers with unique training and the framework provides teachers with the tools and resources they need to support student achievement and social emotional wellbeing. We also leverage our veteran staff by pairing up new teachers with those who have experience to ensure that they have the support they need. There are also numerous leadership opportunities for teachers to increase retention. A high emphasis is placed on creating a culture and climate where staff, students, and families feel welcomed, supported, and connected.

Describe activities

Each spring there are numerous events where preschool parents are introduced to elementary school, both at the preschool site and at the elementary. Also, there are transition meetings with preschool and the home schools to make sure critical information about the student is passed on to the new school. Preschool teachers for the most at risk students are at the home elementary on the first day of school to help with the transition and to assist with parent questions since relationships are stronger with the preschool teacher than the new elementary
